<b>Endonuclease Activity (Nicking)</b> - A 50 µl reaction in NEBuffer 2.1 containing 1 µg of supercoiled PhiX174 DNA and a minimum of 50 Units of BsrGI incubated for 4 hours at 37°C results in <10% conversion to the nicked form as determined by agarose gel electrophoresis.	<b>Pass</b>
<b>Exonuclease Activity (Radioactivity Release)</b> - A 50 µl reaction in NEBuffer 2.1 containing 1 µg of a mixture of single and double-stranded [ <sup>3</sup> H] <i>E. coli</i> DNA and a minimum of 100 units of BsrGI incubated for 4 hours at 37°C releases <0.1% of the total radioactivity.	<b>Pass</b>
<b>Ligation and Recutting (Terminal Integrity)</b> - After a 10-fold over-digestion of Lambda DNA with BsrGI, >95% of the DNA fragments can be ligated with T4 DNA ligase in 16 hours at 16°C. Of these ligated fragments, >95% can be recut with BsrGI.	<b>Pass</b>
<b>Non-Specific DNase Activity (16 Hour)</b> - A 50 µl reaction in NEBuffer 2.1 containing 1 µg of Lambda DNA and a minimum of 100 Units of BsrGI incubated for 16 hours at 37°C results in a DNA pattern free of detectable nuclease degradation as determined by agarose gel electrophoresis.	<b>Pass</b>
